



29 November 2020 — First Sunday of Advent



Dear Holy Spirit Family:

For some, Advent may carry a lot of meaning; for others it may be just a strange sounding word. Some might find this time filled with all sorts of season-specific smells and activities, sounds and celebrations. Others might crave holy emptiness. Yet others might simply look for ways to flee loneliness and a lack of light.

Throughout the *Spirit* (and in every worship bulletin and the weekly e-message) there is detailed information about what is happening at Holy Spirit, be it the Christmas Gathering on December 6; be it the donation of mittens, hats, scarves, and such for the mitten-tree/box; or contributions to the Give a Child a Gift program at the school; or reminders for the meetings of the Anti-Racism Work group, the two Koinonia bible studies; or the Yarns & Needles group. It's all there, and more: You can also find details about worship: the Advent Evening Prayer on Thursdays at 6:30 pm; the Service of Mourning and Lamentation on December 13; our Children's Christmas program on December 20; and, of course, our worship services on Christmas Eve at 8:30 pm and on Christmas Day at 10 am.

In light of all that is given already, and with a big thank you to all who gathered and provided it, I would like to share with you today only a short passage from a devotion by Rev. Rick McCafferty (Inupiaq), found in a publication by Lutheran Indian Ministries for this first Sunday of Advent:

“Every morning, before I start the day, I get up early before anyone else in the house wakes up, (if you live by yourself, then you can do this at any time). I get my Bible and place it on a table. I get two chairs, one for me and one for the Holy Spirit. I invite Jesus to have a seat with me while I pray and talk to Him. Sometimes I cry and let Him know how much I am hurting and how I feel alone. The hardest part for me is to just sit and listen to hear the still small voice of our creator, God our Father.”

I like the idea of getting two chairs, don't you?

In fact, it reminds me of a story about a lonely, nicely upholstered chair that stood empty in an impressively important meeting at the board room of an impossibly big church, which we visited as a group from the seminary in Chicago. Seeing the chair, I fibbed: “Oh, that one is for Elijah!” (Meaning the prophet Elijah that is supposed to come back before the Messiah). But then, much to my surprise, Elijah (or someone whose name could have been Elijah) actually did show up and sat down in it. And wouldn't you know it? The chair broke! So Elijah, who thankfully hadn't gotten hurt, got up, and when I saw the naked wood stick out from the fine upholstery, all I could think about was how it looked just like a cross, and I realized how Jesus is present in our brokenness.

Worship & Music Committee ~ Council Corner



The purpose of the Worship & Music Committee is to plan and offer regular worship opportunities within our congregation, and also to care for our church's musical instruments and implements of worship.

"May your life be interesting!" is an old Chinese saying, and there is some debate about whether it is intended as a blessing or a curse. Either way, there is no doubt that the year 2020 has presented the Worship & Music Committee with many "interesting" situations to work through in order to accomplish its mission. For example, our nation (world!) has suddenly been beset with a pandemic disease caused by a new virus whose name must not be mentioned. *And* because of that, we were prohibited from coming together at church to worship—or even from being in each other's physical presence for a period of several months. *And* this all took place during a time that encompassed our search for a new Pastor—a search that happily came to fruition on May 31 when Pastor Rahel began her ministry among us. *And* the backdrop for all this was a stressful period of social unrest, national elections, economic roller-coastering, home-learning for students, home-working for many employees (that is, if they managed to retain their jobs), home-isolation for many others, and general doom-and-gloom in the news. That's a lot of "*ands*" that have been piled up on us! Worship and fellowship were needed more than ever, but it seemed like there were nothing but roadblocks to creating opportunities for them.

The W&M Committee has been working hard to envision a path forward that would not only meet the spiritual needs of our congregation during these "interesting times," but also remain true to our Lutheran theology. And so (with a great deal of encouragement from our fellow LCHS member, Pastor Lori Kochanski) we embraced a new way to come together in worship and fellowship using Zoom. *And* we have found a way to overcome all the associated technical hurdles....not the least of which was helping the congregation learn how to use this software that most of us had never even heard of when the year began. *And* we envisioned a new way to partake of Holy Communion together—whether in each other's physical presence or not—that we could never have imagined until now. *And* when it was safe to do so, we found a way to safely resume in-person worship, both outdoors in our green area and indoors in our Sanctuary. *And* to address the stress and strain of these "interesting times" we are living in, a new Thursday Evening Prayer Service has been introduced as a midweek pressure valve and spiritual re-charger. Again, that's a lot of "*ands*," but hopefully very constructive ones to help us deal with this situation in which we find ourselves.

It won't be long before our Committee Chairpersons sit down to write their annual reports for 2020, and that will be a better time to summarize the W&M Committee's activities for the entire year—which is still far from over ("second wave" anyone???). For now, it's sufficient to just say thanks to all those who have given of their time

and talents to make everything in the previous paragraph possible: to Pastor Rahel for her creativity, encouragement, and guidance; to our volunteers and staff who have dedicated their spiritual gifts to making it all physically happen; to our partner-Committees who have also been working hard to keep our church active and vital; and to *you* for your support and openness as God leads us forward in new ways—as always, “making all things new.” We have much to be thankful for, especially each other!



Dear Friends and Family,

"It is a good thing to give thanks unto the LORD, and to sing praises unto thy name, O most High: To shew forth thy lovingkindness in the morning, and thy faithfulness every night..." (Psalms 92:1-2)

Happy Thanksgiving to my American family and friends. I miss you most on Thanksgiving because it is truly an American family holiday. This year, however, I am blessed to be able to celebrate it with other missionaries.

An update on our children: Fred, our social worker, visited the children who went to live with relatives. He brought a gift of food and enrolled them in classes set up in the community. He also arranged for them to get a snack since some would not have breakfast before coming. One set of twins, Peter and Paul, is of concern to us because their living situation is not good. Pray for them and for wisdom for Fred on how to remove them from that situation. We are thankful that the new boy who came to us went to live with an uncle who will care well for him.

IAM Bible School Techimantia had its 6th graduation on September 12th, with 5 students graduating. Every graduating class first goes on a mission trip. One of the pictures below is from a crusade on this class's mission trip. Because of COVID-19, we have had fewer schools open this year. We have three other schools currently running, including the one where I am the director. My class is the last picture, those of us hiding behind masks. You will notice there are not masks in many of the pictures. In many areas of Ghana, there are no cases of COVID-19.



Pastor Joemens led an outreach to 156 orphans in the village of Atronie and surrounding areas. We normally help these children with educational needs. Because of the current conditions and the generous donations we received, we sent

them rice, oil, sardines, soap, and added a soda and cookies. We are avoiding group gatherings, so the packages were delivered to their homes. These ones are very needy and the food is very much appreciated.



Pastor Joemens also visited the Jesus Elderly Care people whom we assist with farming. This is in the same village as the children. We are doing an update to our registration and also wanted pictures of some of the produce they harvested. Those who cannot farm themselves have family who does it for them.



We continue to help people with medical concerns, and children with educational needs. One of our IAM Bible School students injured his eye in a farming accident and needed surgery. **Pray** for a full recovery of his eyesight.

We have a very busy season ahead of us:

- ★ CHRISTMAS IS COMING!!! We give food gifts to 90 elderly (\$1,800) & 126 widows and orphans (\$2,520); (\$20/gift)
- ★ In January, school will restart and we will be buying uniforms, shoes, and school supplies.
- ★ In February/March, it will be time for plowing again.

Please pray for us and consider a donation to any one of these ministries.

This will ensure that every voting member has sufficient time to read the reports prior to the Annual meeting and Budget vote. Thank you!


